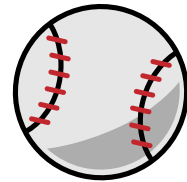

April 11: Wear a Geometric Shape Day

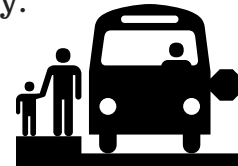
April 13: Wear a Number Day again, we will host the Middle Years' Math Olympics, and the winners of the "Guess the Number of Candies in the Jar" will be announced.
