

It also contains some important information for parent conduct, as well as fee information. If your student athlete did not receive a contract in the spring, they can either see their coach or Mr. Hart for one. Please make sure you review this with your student athlete, sign the contract, and have it returned with payment to the general office before your student athlete plays their first game for the team. All fees must be paid in order for your student to be eligible to play in games and tournaments.

Welcome back to all students! In athletic news the cross country running team will get going with practices at noon hours. Mrs. Kate Babij will be coaching once again. Specific practice times are yet to be determined, but we do have the dates of the two Hanover runs which will be held in Steinbach on Friday, September 20 and on Friday, September 27. Our annual Terry Fox run will be on Thursday, September 26 at 11:00. The community is invited to attend our run as well. Extracurricular teams like volleyball have sign up sheets by the gym doors. This year the fees are \$30 for league and \$30 for a jersey which students may wear in gym classes as an option. GVS is looking for coaches for the grade 7 and 8 boys teams. BUS LOOP & TRAFFIC

Please note that the bus loop is closed to traffic and student drop offs during 8:20 to 9:00 am and 3:25 to 4:00 pm. Student drop-offs can happen on the west entrance of the building on Oak Ave. Please be reminded that the speed limit on Oak Ave. and Park Street is 30 km/h. This is a high traffic area in the mornings and after school with cars entering and leaving GVS, buses carrying students, students being dropped off and pedestrians crossing the road. Please drive safely and slowly.

LANGUAGE CREDITS

PIZZA DAY

Pizza Friday is not going away, but it will look a bit different this year with two major changes taking place. First off, Middle Years students will no longer place their orders with their homeroom teachers but rather at the canteen as soon as they arrive at school. Secondly, cash or cheques will no longer be accepted for Pizza Day purchases. Families can purchase vouchers for pizza and milk in advance and students will use these vouchers when placing their pizza orders. Vouchers will be available through the Parent Portal or at the office from Monday – Thursday and can be paid for on the Parent Portal or by cheque. To purchase vouchers on the Parent Portal, simply add funds to your students account and email gvs@hsd.ca stating amount of vouchers you have paid for, or send a note along with your student. As long as there is a positive balance in your students account it could be used for pizza and milk vouchers. Pizza vouchers are \$1.75/slice, \$1.50 for a 500mL chocolate milk. The first pizza day will be on September 20.

LIBRARY

Summer Reading Program was a success! We had 70 students participate with just over 700 books signed out.

GRADE 5 INDIGENOUS DAY

The grade five classes will be going on their first field trip on September 18. We will be meeting students from Kleefeld school and Bothwell School at the Kleefeld Park to learn about and celebrate aspects of Indigenous cultures. Parent volunteers will be needed, so please ensure that all of your volunteer paperwork is up to date if you are interested in helping out.

STRONG CONNECTIONS

On Friday, September 13 and Monday, September 16 GVS will be implementing Hanover School Division's Strong Connections program with our grades 5-8 students. Strong Connections is designed to enhance the beginning of the year with each student. The activites done during Strong Connections are not tests, but rather tasks to help teachers get to know our students better and how they learn in order to best plan for their instruction early in the school year. The format for Strong Connections also provides an opportunity for teachers to extend and consolidate their understanding of each child through the one-on-one interview/assessment times, and help build a strong foundation for a positive relationship between the child and the teahcer. CHOCOLATE FUNDRAISER

Students will be carrying home cases of chocolates on Monday, September 30. This year GVS will be selling Laura Secord Chocolates (variety pack) in addition to the World's Finest Chocolate almonds. Each case contains 30 boxes of chocolates/almonds and each item is sold for \$3. Each case of items is to be sold as is. All chocolates are peanut free, and the Laura Secord chocolates are nut free. Each child will be given the choice of which case (almonds or Laura Secord) they want to take home.

Students selling one complete case of chocolates will be entered to win a variety of daily prizes. Larger prizes at the end of the sales including a movie gift card, a drone, headphones and a variety of smaller prizes.
