

Important Drop Off And Pick Up Reminders For Parents


We would like to kindly remind parents that they are not to be dropping off students in the main bus loop between 8:20 and 9:00 am and between 3:20-4:00 pm. Parents have been coming into the bus loop and disregarding the bus safety rules.

Here are some VERY IMPORANT REMINDERS FOR ALL PARENTS:

- Flashing red lights indicate that the bus has stopped and that students are getting dropped off. It is illegal to pass a school bus from either direction once it's stopped with lights activated. GVS has had parents disregard these rules and they have been subjected to fines under The Highway Traffic Act.
- Parents are reminded NOT to use Oak Ave. as a drop off for their children. This is a very busy street with bus and vehicle traffic before school starts and at 3:30 pm. We have had numerous "close calls" of students almost being hit by either buses or other vehicles. Students are darting across the street as their parents drop them off on both sides of Oak Ave. Oak Ave. is a high traffic area. Parents need to refrain from stopping, parking and dropping off their students on this street out of convenience for them. GVS is highly concerned about the safety of our students and our community members. We must work together to model and adhere to all traffic laws that are posted on Oak Ave. NO PARKING signs are posted on Oak Ave.
- PARENTS are reminded that the designated drop off area for students in grades 5-8 is on Southwood Street.
 The designated drop off and pick up areas for high school students is along the chain linked fence on Park Street.
- During school hours, we have assigned entrances due to our COVID protocols. Parents may use the bus loop from 9:00 am till 3:15 pm ONLY. Unless your child is in grades 9-12, students will still have to walk around the building to go through their designated entrances.

We must come together to provide the safest environment possible for our students and for our community members. PLEASE do not hesitate to call GVS if you have any questions or concerns. The designated drop off areas have been done in consultation with HSD Transportation and the RCMP. Keeping our students safe is our prime concern.
