The Grade Twelve Design Class takes on the form of a custom furniture or cabinet maker. Students developed a line of questioning based on size, space, budget, style, "must haves" and many other factors and then engaged in a discussion with Mrs. Bourgeois. Students developed a mock up sketch that she approved, then went on to develop working drawings with specific dimensions. With drawings complete, they built the island in the shop which went amazingly fast with that much student horsepower. The main goal of the project is to have students develop a thoughtful line of design questioning with a practical application, but there were many spin offs, from professional communication and planning, to the budgeting of time and money. WHAT SHOULD I DO IF MY CHILD IS SICK?



If your child displays one symptom listed in **Column A** or two or more symptoms listed in **Column B**, even if they are mild, they should immediately self-isolate and get tested for COVID-19. If a child displays such symptoms while at school, a staff member will contact the parent/guardian to pick up their child. Siblings in the same school, or those who attend other HSD schools, will also need to be picked up.

*Please note that if your child displays only one symptom from **Column B** and no symptoms from **Column A**, the school staff may request (in an abundance of caution) that you pick up your child. In such instances, your child can return to school once they are symptom-free for 24 hrs. If individual circumstances exist that you wish to discuss with the school, please contact the principal.*

COLUMN A

Do you have a new onset, or worsening, of any **ONE** of the following symptoms?

- Fever/chills
- Cough
- Sore throat/ hoarse voice
- Shortness of breath/ breathing difficulties
- Loss of taste or smell
- Vomiting or diarrhea for more than 24 hours

COLUMN B

Do you have a new onset, or worsening, of any **TWO** of the following symptoms?

- Runny nose
- Muscle aches
- Fatigue
- Pink eye (conjunctivitis)
- Headache
- Skin rash of unknown cause
- Nausea or loss of appetite
- Poor feeding (if an infant)

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW
