Why do Teens Hide in their rooms?

Many parents often wonder why they see so little of their teenage children. While there are many factors, one psychologist recently suggested two things that are important:

- I) Many parents ask their teens tons of questions. To the teen, it can feel like an interrogation every day.
- The teens start to avoid interactions with parents. Ask yourself, if your teen asked you those same questions each day, would you appreciate it? The solution is to connect without it seeming like an interrogation. Take interest, but do so if you are truly interested. Pay attention to the answers.
- 2) Many teens stay in their room because every time they emerge they are assigned another chore. Again, avoidance becomes the norm. Making time to have positive interactions and not always asking for things can be helpful. Making a list of daily or weekly chores that the teen can look at might be less stressful on all parties rather than resulting in nagging.

Parents who want meaningful relationships with their children must always keep in mind that good relationships take work, good relationships are not always transactional, and that teens need modeling of good behaviour.




