

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

College and University Applications


Please note that the application deadline for applying to the University of Manitoba and University of Winnipeg is March 1, 2025 if you wish to be eligible for an entrance scholarship. This date is also the last date for faculties that have direct entry as an option. Students may still apply after March 1, but the only option will be University 1 at the U of M. You may apply for college at any time, but note that their programs have specific start dates and the spaces do fill up for many of the programs. Some university faculties, like Music, require earlier submissions.



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SLEEP AND ADOLESCENCE

A typical school-aged child needs 8 to 10 hours of sleep per night.
