# IDEAS FOR KEEPING THOSE MATH SKILLS SHARP OVER SUMMER, OR WHAT TO DO ON A RAINY DAY? GAMES WITH CARDS

• Math Facts War - (2 player) Materials: a deck of playing cards.

How to play: divide the deck into two piles. Each player gets a pile, held number side down. On the count of three, each player flips a card over. The first person to correctly find the product (multiply the two cards) gets to keep the cards. The object of the game is to get the whole deck, or largest pile by the set time of play. This can also be played finding the sum (addition) or finding the difference (subtraction).

• Albert's Insomnia – (multi player) Materials: a deck of Albert's Insomnia cards or a deck of playing cards with the 1 face cards removed and the deck separated into low (1–4) and high (5–10)
